- 1. Call to order 6:35.
- 2. Motion to approve minutes. All in favor.
- 3. Principal's report (Patrick Meigs):
 - Superintendent Rhodes has put together a budget and a presentation to use with teachers, parents, and others re: budget message.
 - 2 parts: high-level thinking about strategic investments, and how did the budget come to be and what factors play into school district budget
 - o over the past few years, message has been a "cutting" budget
 - o this year, district is adding staff! Yay!
 - In addition to the 24 positions added last year, there is the potential to add 14 more this year
 - How do we have a "growth" mindset re: a budget?
 - Motion leadership: ready, fire, aim
 - o There are unknowns. Lots of variables.
 - Board sets goals each year
 - Where does the money come from and what's affecting the budget?
 - Districts get 92% of its money from state.
 - 4.5% from local option
 - .2% from foundation (about 2 FTE)
 - o 3.6% from capital levy (facilities bonds = buildings, etc.)
 - for the last 4 biennium (2-year periods of time), schools' percentage has decreased; this biennium, it is going up!
 - Budget is largely people 83% in salary and benefits
 - Student enrollment has been climbing steadily since 1999-2000 school year.
 - In 2008, the amount of money from the local option started to decline due to economy. We are starting to climb out of it, though!
 - Summary:
 - Current budget is on target to meet goals
 - Local option moving up
 - Enrollment is increasing

- Bond and local option are coming to an end; what next?
- Roll-up costs for salaries/staff
- Strategic implications
 - Stability and sustainability
 - Strategic professional development
 - Full school year and full academic schedules (NO furlough days, high school students fill schedules with classes, not early release/studyhalls)
 - Potential strategic addition of staff
 - Keep modest reserve

4. Budget (Josh Dalglish):

- Preliminary budget is on website: Josh went over it
- Budget committee has been meeting to discuss "special" projects from PTA members, teachers, and others
 - Total funding proposals = \$22,800 (many proposals are an "up to" amount)
 - Proposals have been prioritized into 3 tiers based off PTA mission.
 - Summary: leveled literacy books, iPads, computer and tech resident (person), math Olympiads, artist in residence, battle of the books, title I books, zoo school, chess program, children's day celebration
- Thanks to budget committee for their work on this process.
- 5. "Changing the Face of the PTA" talk: Tues., May 6 @ 6:45 at Jefferson High School.
- 6. School lunch discussion (Jim Fitch)
 - The school district has a policy that all students should have time to eat lunch. There is no set time that is set by the schedule made by building principals.
 - Question: Are there other students who complain about not having time to eat lunch?
 - Q: What is the allotted time? 20 minutes start to finish, though there is some flexibility depending on the day.
 - Challenges: How do you put into the schedule enough time to eat, play, and do curriculum?
 - If kids don't get done w/lunch, they are welcome to stay and eat.
 - With only 20 minutes, no room for error.
 - Patrick: Think about ways to have kids play before they eat.
